### About the George Almond Officer of the Year Banquet







The Police Benevolent Association has long held the reputation for educating the public about the daily work of law enforcement officers and the sacrifices they make to keep their communities safe. These education efforts have led to partnerships with the community that have benefited members of the PBA and the law enforcement profession. The PBA also has an extensive history of creating solid and sustainable relationships with elected officials to effect positive change for our members. Almond, a PBA member was shot in the line of duty in October 2001. He survived the shooting and returned to duty as a detective in juvenile investigations before retiring in August 2004. The award recognizes outstanding achievement in the areas of leadership, community service, mentoring, excellence in performance, and valor.



#### Police Benevolent Foundation

As part of the banquet, funds are raised for the Police Benevolent Foundation through a live auction. These funds are used to replace the salaries of fallen officers, provide disaster relief for law enforcement officers displaced through natural disasters, and provide scholarships for the children of law enforcement officers. The "Behind the Badge" program is the Police Benevolent Foundation's newest initiative and was created to prevent officer suicides. Research shows that the biggest threat to an officer's career may be the officer himself. Each year more than 150 officers die in the line of duty; however, the number of officers who die by their own hands is more than double that amount. "Behind the Badge" provides training, education and resources to law enforcement and the community about the dangers of on the job stress and PTSD.
